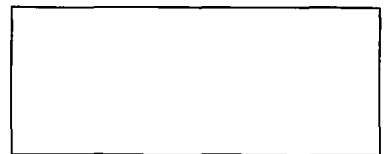
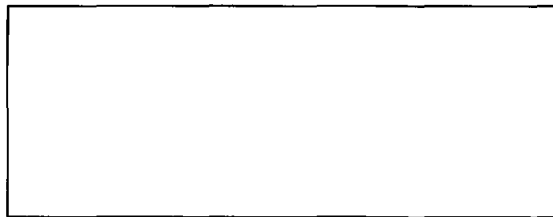

Key Current Warning Issues

The DCI Strategic Warning Committee considers the following the most critical warning issues during the next few weeks. [REDACTED]

Venezuela. There are increased signs that Venezuelan business leaders and military officers are becoming dissatisfied with President Chavez, and he clearly is concerned and is trying to tone down his rhetoric. The opposition has yet to organize itself into a united front. If the situation further deteriorates and demonstrations become even more violent or if Chavez attempts an unconstitutional move to add to his powers, the military may move to overthrow him. [REDACTED]
